Rom. 12:8, "he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness."

prophecy προφητεία

ἀγάπη *agape*love, divine love toward all mankind, general word for love

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ἀνυπόκριτος (anhypokritos), unfeigned, genuine, no ulterior motives.

πονηρός (ponēros), in a poor condition, sick, bad, evil, wicked

1. The term *poneros* is used 72× in the New Testament.

It is used of demons (Matt. 12:45, Luke 7:21, Acts 19:15), the devil (Matt. 13:19, John 17:15, Eph. 6:16; 1 John 2:13, 14), the Pharisees (Matt. 12:34), a synonym for disobedience (Matt. 18:32), it describes the inner corrupt nature (Mark 7:23), even the inner corrupt nature of His disciples (Luke 11:13).

Luke 11:13, "If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!"

John 17:15, "I do not ask You to take them out of the world, but to keep them from the evil one."

2. The first occurrence of evil is in Genesis 2:9, the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

3. Everything that proceeds from the sin nature, i.e., both counterfeit righteousness as well as sin, comes under the category of "evil." Religion is perhaps one of the greatest evils.

2 Cor. 11:13, "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ.

2 Cor. 11:14, "And no wonder! For Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light.

2 Cor. 11:15, "Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also transform themselves into ministers of righteousness, whose end will be according to their works."

κολλάω (kollaomai Lexical kollaō), join, cleave to, stick to; [translates the Heb dabaq "to cleave to"]

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ἀγαθός agathos
Adjective dat neut sing
good, that which is intrinsically good

Rom. 12:10, "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another;

Rom. 12:11, "not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord;

Rom. 12:12, "rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer;

Rom. 12:13, "distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality."
